
drive-AMS Networking Event - 16 October 2025

drive-AMS Masterclass follow up sessions in Greece and Cyprus

The drive-AMS Masterclass follow-up sessions are well underway. On 15 May and 10 September, the first and second meeting with the Greek hospitals took place, with excellent participation from all invited institutions. Hospitals presented the progress of their AMS projects, highlighted key achievements, and openly discussed challenges.

In Cyprus, the second follow-up meeting was held on 20 June. Participants actively contributed by sharing updates, identifying barriers, and exchanging strategies and best practices. The Cyprus group will meet again online on 9 October.

In parallel, preparations are ongoing for a new round of the international Point Prevalence Survey (PPS). This initiative will support hospitals in assessing the impact of their AMS projects, monitoring antimicrobial use and resistance patterns, and benchmarking their results against international standards.
