#### **Upcoming course in Tanzania: combined AMS/IPC track**

From 26 to 28 November, the drive-AMS/IPC Masterclass will take place once again in Dar es Salaam, Tanzania. This marks the second time that the drive-AMS masterclass in Tanzania combines Antimicrobial Stewardship (AMS) with an Infection Prevention and Control (IPC) track, following last year's success. The training will be delivered by trainers from Muhimbili National Hospital, supported by international drive-AMS/IPC experts. Over the course of three intensive days, 32 healthcare professionals from various hospitals across Tanzania will come together to gain the skills and knowledge needed to initiate and implement their own AMS or IPC improvement projects within their hospitals.

#### **New publication**

In a new publication, S. Kuijpers et al. (2025) evaluate the effectiveness of the 2-year ESCMID Antimicrobial Stewardship (AMS) Certificate programme. Forty participants from 22 countries completed online and live courses and implemented local AMS projects. All passed the final exam, and 88% submitted project reports, 84% of which showed positive impacts on antibiotic use or patient outcomes. The study demonstrates that the programme successfully enhances AMS knowledge, skills, and measurable practice improvements across clinical settings.
